A reminder to everyone that across both schools including the Preschool we have a NO NUTS IN SCHOOL policy. Due to severe reactions that many of our children have we must stress the importance of no nut products being brought in to school in any capacity.

Please ensure that all children in KS2 [Year 3, 4, 5 and 6] bring only fruit or vegetables as a healthy snack to eat at break time. We are sourcing some free fruit for the children but currently can only offer free fruit to the infant children and bagels across all schools.

Please only send your child in with fresh water, not flavoured or juice. We do monitor the children but have had incidents where a child has accidently drank from another child's container. Due to allergies and being a Healthy School which follow the NHS Guidelines we implore you to support us. Many of you say your child doesn't like plain water, I can assure you that this week the taps across the schools have been regularly used to fill up bottles and cups for those that have not brought in a bottle. Trust us and support us please to keep everyone safe.

# Physical Education [PE]/





#### Preschool

This week, **preschool** have opened their doors for the new term, teachers were very excited to meet the new children and they have all been amazing! We explored the classroom and have been getting to know each other, the click clack car tracks, mud kitchen and sand tray were a big hit! They also enjoyed playing with some forzen sea creatures inside, the children explored ways of getting the creatures out and made a start on learning new vocabulary for example 'frozen' 'melting'. **Next week**, we will look at our five core songs and our first core book 'Dear Zoo'.

### Reception

This week in **Class 1 and 2**, we have been welcoming the children into school for their first sessions. They have enjoyed exploring the classroom and gardens and getting to know the children and adults in our setting. We have shared stories, sang songs and rhymes and had fun getting used to new routines together! **Next week,** we will be building up to full days in school, exploring the rest of the school site and beginning some phonics and maths sessions together as whole classes!

#### year 1

What a busy and amazing week in **Class 3 and** Class **4**! We have investigated our new classrooms and the garden area. The children have been learning classroom routines and becoming familiar with lessons which will continue with a more structured timetable. **Next week,** we are also excited about PE and Forest School:

#### Class 3: Forest School Wednesday & PE Thursday

Class 4: PE Wednesday and Forest School Thursday

This week, in **Class 5** and **6**, the children have been busy showing us all about them. This has included self-portraits, sentence writing and pictograms. They have learnt how to spell numbers as words up to 100. It has been lovely getting to know them and lots of numbers in boxes have been given as they have followed the Golden Rules. Well done Year Two! **Next week**, we look forward to seeing them bright and early on Monday ready to start our new text in English 'The Journey' and place value in Maths.

Class 5: Forest School Friday & PE Monday

Class 6: PE Friday and Forest School Monday

This week in **Beech** and **Chestnut Classes**, the Year 3's settled in well and are starting to get use to the routines at junior school. In English, we started our class novel, 'The Lion the Witch and the Wardrobe'. In science, we started our unit animals including humans and focused on eating habits and discussing the pros and cons of sugar in our diets. In singing assembly, the children sat and sang beautifully, giving their best efforts. **Next week**, we will be starting PE which will be **Monday and Friday for Beech class and Thursday and Friday for Chestnut**. A polite reminder to make sure your child brings in a healthy snack, labelled uniform items and a labelled water bottle.

This week in **Holly** and **Willow Classes** we have begun perimeter work in maths. We loved measuring the perimeter of different shapes using our feet! In English we have been exploring the features of recounts and reading 'Boy Overboard', which is set in a country very different to ours. **Next week,** we will be going **swimming on Wednesday**, please ensure your child has their swimming kit at school and no earrings on that day please. (One piece swimsuit or trunks, towel, cap, goggles if your child uses them). We will also be planning our own recount and extending our understanding of perimeter.

#### Year 5

This week **Oak** and **Ash Classes** have had a great start to the new school year. 'The Nowhere Emporium' is our class book and we met the characters. In maths we have looked at negative numbers; what do they mean and how to read them on scales/ number lines. We have spent time thinking about how we can be the best versions of ourselves. **Next week** we will have **PE on Wednesday and Thursday**. Most children have library books now so please can they read at home. Practising times tables is always very helpful and the children have had paper copies of spelling words.

### Year 6

This week in **Pine** and **Sycamore Classes**, we have enjoyed learning about our new responsibilities as Year 6's. We started to read the 'Secret Garden' in English, and next week will start our writing based on a film unit. In maths, we have begun to look at algebraic structures, exploring the relationships between parts and wholes. We have enjoyed our first humanities lessons, looking at California in geography and the ancient city of Baghdad in history. Finally, in science we began our topic on light and will apply this knowledge next week to our first experiment. The children have shown real maturity this week – what a wonderful start to their last year at Hartford. Our **PE sessions are Tuesday and Wednesday.**
