I hope that **Junior Parents** were able to read our letter concerning undesirable language used by *some* children towards others in school. It is important that we have a united front about the use of any language that makes others feel uncomfortable and together reinforce that it is not tolerated. Each week, I lead an assembly in the **Junior School** about our **7 Golden Rules** and how they are underpinned by the **5 British Values**. As **Christmas** approaches, our children often want to send festive cards. In the **Infant School** there will be designated post boxes in each class for the children to pop their cards in [dates tbc]. Please ensure that the children's name is on the envelope and their class number. Unfortunately we cannot issue name lists due to GDPR. Over in the **Junior School** the children like to give them out at designated times in classrooms.

Our **Christmas Fetes** will run as previously in December, with every child invited to the school halls to participate in a wealth of festive activities. In the **Infant School** this includes seeing Santa's Lil Elf in the grotto. All we ask in return is a donation of £5 to cover the costs [ticket includes 1 trip to Elfridges, free entry to the colouring competition or Christmas Quiz for a prize, trip to the fete and a goody bag]. This will be organised through **Parent Pay** for the week beginning 20th November 2023.

Preschool

This week, **preschool** thought about emotions exploring them through stories, games and sensory bottles. We named emotions and learnt how we can make others feel happy! We focused on finger gym activities to help strengthen the muscles and skills needed for writing. We had fun placing buttons along lines and threading hoops onto tall spaghetti! **Have a try at home!** We built rockets with construction blocks and practised our 'zoom, zoom, zoom going to the moon' song, counting back down from 5 to blast off. **Next week,** we will singing about numbers and see how numbers can change and represent numbers on our fingers.

Reception

This week **Class 1 and 2**, have explored materials, sorting objects and describing their properties in very simple terms. We made story maps to retell 'The Tiger Who Came to Tea' and enjoyed using new equipment at Forest School. **Next week**, we will think about which material might be best to use to make a shopping bag. We will plan and carry out a simple fair test. Thank you for sharing your autumn walks, art and observations on Tapestry. **Please continue to use Tapestry to share your child's home learning.** The children love sharing this with their friends in Reception!

Year 1

This week in Class 3 and Class 4, we enjoyed learning to subtract by counting back and breaking numbers apart. Through our enquiry lessons we have been designers and have been investigating the key features and purpose of bags. We have designed and made a mock-up of our bag ready for next week when we will begin to make it. Next week, in English we are looking forward to writing about our families - please send in your family photos!

Year 2

This week, in Class 5 and 6, we learnt about nouns and how to improve them with appropriate adjectives. We had fun using post it notes to label nouns from the story 'The Way Back Home'. We learnt that nouns are words that can name objects, animals, places and a person. The children solved addition and subtraction problems using the column method. The children have been persevering in design and technology lessons with their sewing skills. It's not easy threading and knotting a needle but they did it! It certainly helped having family volunteers on hand. If you would like to come next Tuesday at 1:30pm please let us know. Many thanks. Next week, we will focus on expanded noun phrases. E.g The speedy, red aeroplane. In maths we will identifying coins and notes and learn how to count them.

This week in **Beech** and **Chestnut Classes**, we looked at the key features of a non-chronological report and we created a plan of our own! In maths, we explored 3-digit numbers focusing on place value, addition, and subtraction. **We have added work on to Seesaw to familiarise the children with the app.** In science we investigated different types of rocks including sedimentary, igneous and metamorphic. In geography, we learnt why people live on mountains and how they have adapted to make living conditions manageable. We focused on the Alps in Switzerland and next **week** we will learn about living in the Andes.

This week in **Holly** and **Willow Classes** we used adjectives to create expanded noun phrases. We enjoyed writing descriptive paragraphs about 'The Rocketeer'. In maths, we explored measures - length and capacity and used this understanding to solve problems. The children loved their music lesson, exploring the rhythm of samba and how different instruments are incorporated into one piece of music. In PE, we are coming to the end of our work on our Spy dance choreography. **We still need plastic bottles, thank you for sending more in. Next week**, we explore retelling a story from a different perspective and explore the properties of polygons.

This week **Oak** and **Ash Classes** learnt about common factors, prime numbers and square numbers. We've been writing the second part of our suspense narrative and have tried really hard to use exciting vocabulary. In science, we refreshed our knowledge of the planets in our solar system and went outside to make a video about the distances of the planets from the sun. In geography, we focused on oceans and climate and how the currents impact the weather. We carried on our dribbling and ball control skills in PE.

Year 6


This week in **Pine** and **Sycamore Classes** we started to look at what a fraction is and how they can be represented. Some of us have looked at equivalent fractions, how to work them out and use them to compare and order fractions with different denominators. In English we have looked at our different word classes and identified them in text, we have also discovered more about the relationship between Mary and Colin in 'The Secret Garden'. Little Miss and Mr Men characters played a key part in our science lesson on adaptation as we continue to learn about evolution. **Next week**, in design technology we will be starting to build the playgrounds we have designed.


