Preschool

This week, **preschool** continued learning about Christmas. We have sung Christmas songs, having great fun using the jingle bells! We linked this to phonics learning by following 'stop' and 'go' instructions as well as 'fast' 'slow' 'quiet' and 'loud' and trying to shake our bells to match the syllables of the word. We found it funny singing about Santa getting stuck in the chimney! We made paper chains, it took perseverance to learn the skill of manipulating the paper into a chain! We loved our Christmas dance session with Miss Charlotte, rocking around the Christmas tree and finding ways to move our bodies to be reindeers! **Next week** we will introduce a Christmas tree into the classroom and use our fine motor skills to hang decorations, we will be printing our Christmas folders. We will learn, 'The Robots Came To Dinner On Christmas Day' song linking to a phonics activity where we will 'feed some sounds' to our robot!

Reception

This week **Class 1 and 2**, have been busy singing festive songs and using a range of percussion instruments to tap out a rhythm. We have been thinking about playing fast and slow and have learned the word 'tempo'. In maths we have been investigating wholes and parts of objects and exploring ways to compose and de-compose sets of 2 and 3. We have been using our phonic arm to help us to segment CVC words to write simple labels and captions. **Next week**, in PSHE we will be thinking about our thoughts and feelings and how we can be kind to one another and get along with our friends. We will also be making Christmas cards and party hats!

Year 1

This week in **Class 3 and Class 4**, we have been busy practicing our play. In maths we have been learning about 2D shapes. In music we have been playing instruments fast and slow and hearing different tempos. **Next week,** we are looking forward to seeing you at our nativity play on Tuesday morning.

Year 2

This week, in **Class 5** and **6**, in English we looked at a friend's piece of writing and assessed their work. We looked for capital letters, full stops, conjunctions and neat handwriting. In maths we calculated change in 5 pence. In science we completed an investigation about the suitability of materials. We were proud of the Year 2 Choir who entertained The Cambridge Oddfellows society at their Christmas party. **Next week** there is no PE or Forest School. We will begin our Christmas preparations by making hats, tree decorations and cards. In English we will write instructions and in maths we are learning to tell the time to the hour, half hour and quarter hours.

This week in **Beech** and **Chestnut Classes**, completed NFER tests and did an excellent job. We finished our cradles of civilization unit in history and our mountains unit in geography. In science, we conducted a mini experiment to determine which type of soil would drain the most water and which would soak up most of the water. **Next we**ek, it will be Christmas Jumper day and Christmas dinner, the children will also be making Christmas cards. We are really proud of the children for their efforts this week!

This week in **Holly** and **Willow Classes** we completed assessments. We enjoyed making our torches in DT using a working prototype. In science, we connected our understanding of the water cycle from Y3 to our work on states of matter. We enjoyed investigating the processes involved in the water cycle and how water transforms from liquid to gas and back to liquid or solid. In English, we explored newspaper reports, this caused excitement as it is linked to our Roman Empire topic. **Next week,** we will begin to draft our own newspaper reports and in maths we will explore multiples of 9.

Year 5

This week **Oak** and **Ash Classes** have worked hard with assessments. It's been wonderful to see so many of them with such a positive, happy attitude. In PE, we have continued hockey and looked at rock 'n' roll dancing. In history, we learnt new vocabulary related to the Anglo Saxons, and in geography we discussed the impacts humans have on the oceans. **Next week**, we will continue with fractions and focus on our class text, 'Nowhere Emporium'. The **Science Dome** is coming. Please can children continue to come to school in weather appropriate clothing, i.e., coats, full trousers, tights etc. Thank you for the continued support with the PE kit/uniform.

This week in **Pine** and **Sycamore Classes** we continued looking at multiplying fractions by other fractions and integers. In English we looked at the role of symbolism in texts, applying this to our writing on the Alchemists letter. We completed a writing assessment, finishing a narrative themed around a magical wishing well. We tied together all the grammar we have studied this term and produced some wonderful work. In science, we completed our Evolution—topic by making fact files about rare and exotic animals that have benefited from natural selection. In PSHE, we had thoughtful discussions about stereotypes around bullies, with the children challenging their preconceptions about who the victim/perpetrators are. Finally, in geography we considered the impact humans have on oceans and came up with strategies the children can use to protect the planet for the future.
