

## Preschool

**This week**, we began planting flower seeds thinking about the link to Spring and new growth. We did an amazing jobs of marking our own pots with our names. We also saw lots of mark making linked to our story, 'The Three Little Pigs' – there is a video of the story read by **Mrs Shurlock** on **Tapestry** for your child to share with you at home.

**Next week,** we will continue reading, 'The Three Little Pigs' and begin to recall the story independently. It would be great to have sticks and straw to support this, if anyone is able to collect/donate these items, we would be very grateful.






#### Year R

This week we have been using our phonic knowledge to write labels and captions for pictures using taught Stage 2 and 3 phonics. In maths we have been exploring the concept of 'doubles' and using stem sentences such as 'This is a double because 3 is a part and 3 is a part' and '6 is made of 3 and 3 and 3 and 3 make 6'. In Forest School, lots of children enjoyed using sticks, bark, leaves and other natural resources to create a home for a British wild animal like a mouse, hedgehog or rabbit!

**Next week** in art we will be using pencils to explore mark making and looking at some of Pablo Picasso's early pencil sketches and drawings to inspire us! In maths we will be talk about and exploring 2D and 3D shapes e.g. circles, rectangles, triangles and cuboids using informal and mathematical language such as 'sides', 'corners'; 'straight', 'flat' and 'round'.


Your child has brought home a special **Spring Concert Songbook** today! Please ask them to teach you some of the songs we are busy practising for our **Concert at 9.15am** on **Tuesday 1st April.** They are beginning to know them well and should even be able to teach you some of the Makaton signs we are using for words like 'Spring', 'sunshine', 'rain', 'grow' and 'flower'!

















**This week**, in English we used adjectives to describe 'Gerald the giraffe's' appearance and his feelings. We looked at similarities and differences of towns and the countryside in geography. **Next week**, in maths we will be looking at weight and capacity.




**This week**, in English, we enjoyed making our very own pea in a box to accompany the story, 'The Pea and the Princess', by Mini Grey. We worked out how to subtract two 2-digit numbers in maths, using a jotting to help us. In geography we learnt how St. Andrews Day is celebrated in Scotland. The children were keen to make shortbread at home **Recipe: Tweety Shortbread - CBeebies** 

**Next week**, in English we will make a miniature book and sequence the story in order. In maths, we will focus on multiplying and dividing in 2s, 5s and 10s. <u>Multiplying and dividing - KS1 Maths - BBC Bitesize</u> In our exploration of the UK, we are off to Wales next.





**This week**, in maths we have been exploring numbers to 1,000, thinking about the previous multiple of 10 and the next multiple of 10, the children demonstrated some excellent perseverance with this. In Science we really enjoyed thinking about the human skeleton and had great fun making a split pin skeleton. We have also been practising our chopping and peeling skills in DT ready to create our seasonal snack. **Next week**, in English we will be planning and writing a narrative and in maths we will be continuing our fantastic work looking at numbers to 1,000 and using a range of resources to support our learning.





**This week,** we worked in groups to make our own biscuits in Design Technology [DT]. We demonstrated excellent **teamwork** skills and followed instructions wonderfully. **Next week,** they will write a **narrative** about the Oompa Loompas from our class novel 'Charlie and the Chocolate Factory', using our creativity to write about where these characters came from.





**This week,** we have been practising our communication and group work skills and making bridges in Design Technology [DT]. We have all settled into the hall brilliantly - Possibly some children even prefer it!

**Next week,** we will begin to write our own narrative story in English, showcasing all the skills we have learnt in our SPAG [Spelling and Grammar] sessions this half term.



### Year 6

**This week,** we have been looking at question tags, colons and semi-colons in English and have also finished reading, 'Street Child'. In maths, we were looking at ratio and proportions and in science we have been thinking about how the heart works. **Next week,** we will be learning about hurricanes in geography and converting metric units of measurement in maths.


















### **RED NOSE DAY...**





## **Computing Coaching...**



Making Online Viewing Safer for Children There is so much amazing content online for children and young people, but as we all know, some of that content isn't suitable for younger eyes and ears. Much of the most serious and concerning content it being viewed and consumed at home, often in the child's bedroom. There is plenty of help and support available for parents and carers, including from organisations such as <a href="Internet Matters">Internet Matters</a> who have a fantastic advice guide to make online viewing safer for children. Within this guide there is advice on filters and parental controls, advice about watching and browsing together, screen time and more. You can access the guide <a href="here">here</a>. What is Kick Streaming? You might be aware of Twitch, especially if your children are gamers. Owned by Amazon it has become incredibly popular over the years for children to either watch live streams or to live stream themselves. But in the past there's been plenty of controversy about the platform,

particularly in relation to restrictions that were imposed upon streamers. So it's no surprise to see other platforms becoming more popular and one of those platforms is **Kick** (*not* to be confused with Kik Messenger). It was launched in 2022, **users should be aged 13 years+** and it follows the same process as Twitch where live streamers can make money. However, much of the content on Kick is adult in nature. **Internet Matters** has a good article about Kick and you can find the article here <u>What is Kik?
