This month we are polishing our Czec phrases with the help of Miss Kayleigh Reid. Each morning in Ready to Learn and Routine time the children in the Infant School learn about the Czech Republic. If you have any books, photos or artefacts we can use for our display, please pop them into school. Last month Andrei in Class 5 shared so many resources for our Romanian display and the children loved exploring them.

Preschool

This week **preschool** were very happy to welcome all of their children and families back and hear all about their adventures over the Easter break as well as welcoming new starters who have all been superstars! We began reading our core story of 'The Gruffalo'. We used natural resources such as flowers and leaves to make 'potions' and make marks on paper to represent what we had made. **Next week**, in PE we will move like different types of transport. As well as introducing games and puzzles based around 'The Gruffalo' story.

Reception

This week **Class 1 and 2** have started a new enquiry learning on Antarctica by sharing a letter and then getting to meet a real Antarctic scientist, Jerome! We had a look at some real Antarctic clothing worn by members of the British Antarctic Survey. The children thought about what they would like to find out about Antarctica and we started to think about the similarities and differences between England and Antarctica. Our new literacy focus book is 'Peace At Last' and the children have loved using our story shelves and props to retell this story. **Next week** we will be learning about what it is like to visit Antarctica and look closely at the animals that live there.

This week **Class 3 and Class 4** have started to learn about Antarctica. We were lucky to try on some Antarctica clothing from the British Antarctic Survey and enjoyed listening to our visitor Jerome about his recent work out in Antarctica. In English we read 'The Day the Crayons Came Home' by Drew Daywalt and discussed our favourite crayon and parts of the story. In maths we learnt about doubles and halves using our knowledge to solve some missing numbers on bar models. **Next week,** in science we will discuss where animals live and begin to group and classify them.

This week Class 5 and 6 began 'The Story Machine' by Tom Mclaughlin and discussed the story setting. In maths we learnt how to find halves and quarters of amounts. We practised how to subtract on an empty number line. We loved being geographers by naming the continents and oceans of the world. What fun we had looking at the clothing worn by Scientists from the British Antarctic Survey. **Next week,** in English we will write clear instructions on how machines work. We are sure the children will love the Wallace and Gromit animations for this! In maths we will look at equivalent fractions. In science we will explain why animals are/are not suited to their environment. In DT we need strong, sturdy boxes, shoe boxes are ideal but cereal box are not sturdy enough. If you have any spare then please send them in.

Year 3

This week **Beech** and **Chestnut** have been editing our English work and started our new class novel, 'The Nothing to See Here Hotel'. We began learning about volcanoes and in art we started our sculpture topic. The children had a fantastic first swimming session. We walked to the pool beautifully and were very patient while everyone was being assessed. A polite reminder to please label all clothing items and towels for your child! **Next week**, we will start learning about Ancient Greece.

year 1

This week **Holly and Willow Classes**, wrote letters to the Mayor persuading him to/not to build an IKEA on our field...watch this space for the outcome! We investigated a nonfiction text linked to earthquakes and started reading our new text, 'Krindlekrax'. In maths, we explored what makes a 'whole' and what is 'part' of a 'whole' as to support fraction work. In science, we asked questions about our teeth and their functions. Art was exciting as we learnt about Antony Gormley and the types of sculptures he does. This will inspire our own sculpture making over the next few weeks. **Next week**, we find out what Ruskin does next in 'Krindlekrax'. We are excited about our teambuilding activities at Burwell and in school. For wk beg 29.4.2024 please send your child with their toothbrush, toothpaste and a face cloth for an investigation. Your child will choose how they participate in an investigation. We will use a disclosing tablet to show what our teeth look like before cleaning and after cleaning. It would be wonderful, if all children have the opportunity to choose to participate because they have their equipment at school.

Year 5

This week **Oak** and **Ash** Classes have started their new class book, 'Who Let the Gods Out?'. In maths, they have been looking at perimeter and area of compound shapes. In science, we conducted experiments to see which substances were soluble and insoluble. **Next week**, we will continue learning the skills to play tennis.

Year 6

This week **Pine** and **Sycamore** classes have practised answering different types of questions in reading. In English, we researched Victorian workhouses to write a non-chronological report. Maths has involved us looking at 3D shapes and their nets, then moving onto looking at line graphs. In science, we have written an explanation text on the circulatory system. Finally, the children all enjoyed our PE lessons, which this term will focus on cricket and football. Thank you to all those who completed their Easter homework and entered our art competition.
