


Preschool

This week, we have been busy planting and linking new vocabulary such as 'roots' and 'shoots' we looked to see how our beans have begun to grow and planted some marigolds and peas. In PE and in the garden we focused on our balancing skills. In our phonics learning we introduced a new sound 'n'.

Next week, we will be using dice to explore a difficult way to represent number and continue our Very Hungry Caterpillar activities with puzzles and recalling order by 'feeding' our caterpillar (tubes) the food and fruit.





Year R

This week, we have found out more about, 'The Wright Brothers' and the first flight, looking at books to help us. We created our own personal timelines, beginning to think about the past and the present. In our literacy sessions we have been using our phonic knowledge to write captions and sentences about the story of, *'The Three Little Pigs'* and in maths we have explored odd and even numbers. We have also enjoyed exploring how quantities can be shared equally in a practical hands-on way. We enjoyed 'hiding' our pebbles in the local park for Empathy Day.

Next week, in our computing sessions we will be using the programmable Bee-Bots and building commands to move them. In maths we will be learning how to use a Rekenrek to support us with our 'mastering number' learning.

Year 1

This week, we made changes to the story of '*Anansi and the Golden Pot*' and made it our own in English. In maths, our teachers were impressed with our ability to use the equality symbols, <, > and =. **On Empathy Day, we enjoyed leaving decorated pebbles at the park for members of our community to find.** Next week in science, we will think of a question that we can investigate and we'll begin to look at the artist Antony Gormley in art.





Year 2

This week, we wrote the beginning of our story remembering to include time words in English. We had great fun in maths making 3D shapes so we could learn about their vertices, faces and edges. We learnt about the layers of a bulb in science. We loved Empathy Day! We hid our pebbles down by the river...

Next week in English, we will continue the middle and end of our story based on '*Lila and the Secret of the Rain*'. In maths, we will interpret and construct simple pictograms. In our enquiry lessons we will explore sources to talk about the life of the Wright brothers.


















Year 3

This week, we have been planning our own newspaper articles based on an exciting moment from our class text '*The Nothing to See Here Hotel*'. We have really enjoyed Empathy Day where we explored the meaning of empathy, created our own class positive affirmations and created our own kindness pebbles. Next week, we will be writing our newspaper reports in English and in Science we will be investigating teeth. Please could children bring in a toothbrush to support with this investigation. Thank you in advance for this!

Year 4

This week, we took part in the DfE Multiplication Tables Check and we are so proud of what we achieved. We had wonderful attitudes leading up to the check, we aimed high and got involved by practising at school and in our own time at home. We were very creative during Empathy Day and enjoyed the assembly video. Next week, we will be focusing on healthy teeth in science. We will be conducting an experiment, so we are asking children to bring in their toothbrushes (electric or manual). We will be using disclosing tablets. If you have any questions or concerns, please speak to a member of the year 4 team.







Year 5

This week, have been completing our narrative in our English lessons. We have been continuing to build on our fractions knowledge by looking at how to work out fractions of quantities. It would be really beneficial for all children to continue to practise their timetables facts at home. We really enjoyed Empathy Day on Thursday – especially the pebble painting.

Next week, we have assessment week. This is a chance to show off all of our learning from this year. We will continue with PE; Athletics and Cricket.

Year 6

This week has been busy, we have been making boxes in maths using our shape net knowledge and working out the measurements ourselves. In English we have started to look at some characters in 'Broken', they will go towards creating a narrative with dialogue to advance the action. We were split in PE, some of us went swimming and the rest of us played rounders – we were great! We have also been rehearsing the play and creating props – we have some lovely singing for you to hear! Empathy Day was a day for understanding how other people feel and how we can positively impact other people's feelings.

Next week, we will continue our writing in English and our play rehearsals.

- Year 6 have been swimming how exciting! Please note that swimming is a statutory element of the national curriculum for PE, children should leave Year 6 with the following skills:
 - swim competently, confidently and proficiently over a distance of at least 25 metres
 - use a range of strokes effectively [for example, front crawl, backstroke and breaststroke]
 - • perform safe self-rescue in different water-based situations
